Candace Masters: Art Education in Art and Design (Alex and Alice)
(PPT in file)
 - Art education one part of Art and Design (Fine arts, art and design, education)
 - Degree programs – BFA in Art Education, BFA in Art and design with multiple concentrations, BA in Art and Design, BA Art History, BFA in interior design, MSED in Art Education
 - BFA is more professional degree; BA includes more liberal arts
 - Minors and certificates as well.
 - Art Therapy is important for many Ex. Ed .students; there are currently no professional credentials offered for Art Therapy (This may move forward in the future).
 - Students can take graduate credits in Art Ed (non-matriculated) to pair with another content area degree.
 - Academic Roadmap slide presented
 - The programs foster both breadth and depth for art education majors.
 - Upton hall houses over 45 unique and two studios – Czrules-Nelson Gallery and Bacon.
 - Certification is P-12; two placements – elementary and middle/high school.
 - Some graduate electives are available for students without art backgrounds. Interdisciplinary courses are available – [may send list of focuses to share in minutes]. Teaching Art to students with special needs.
