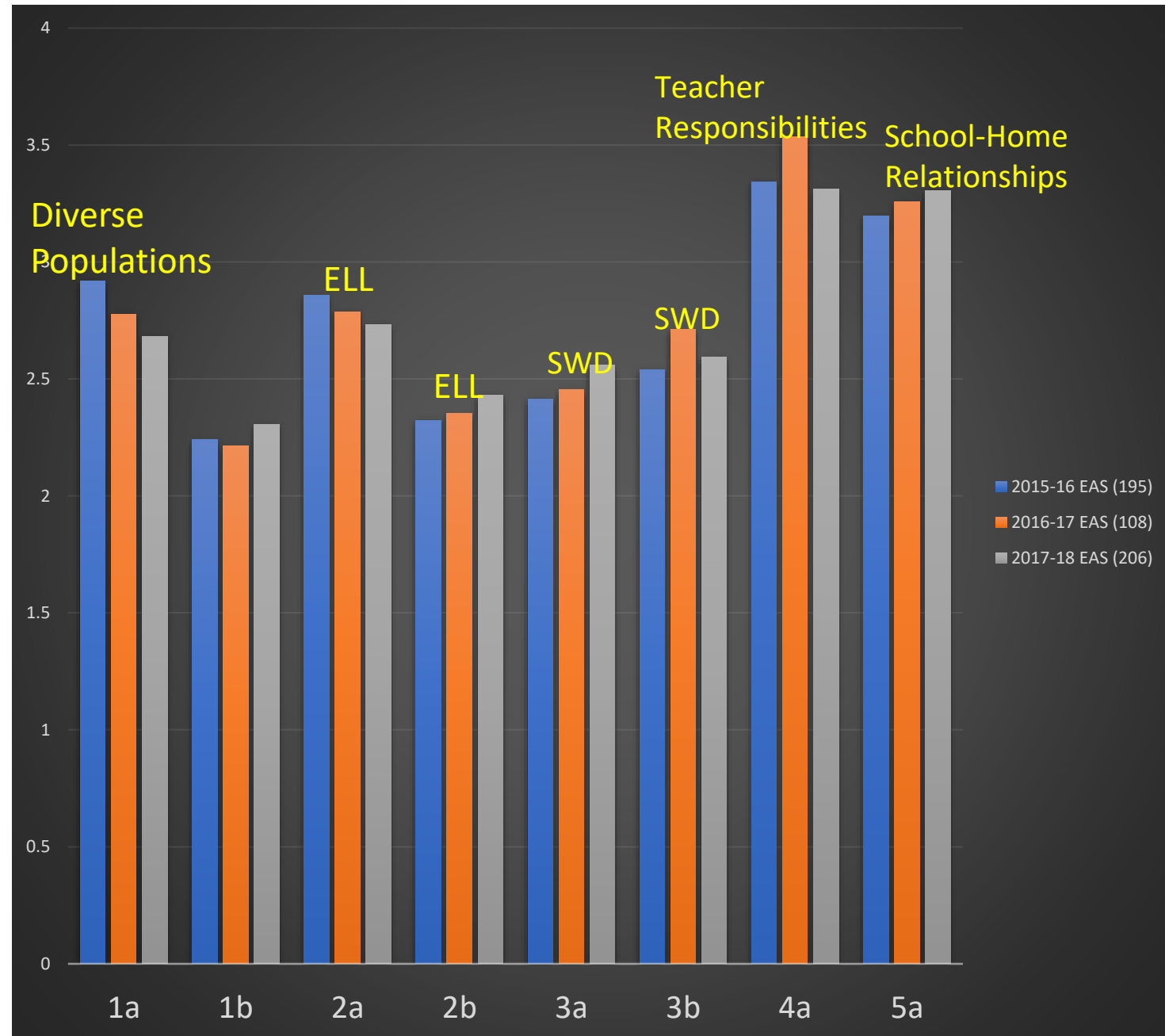

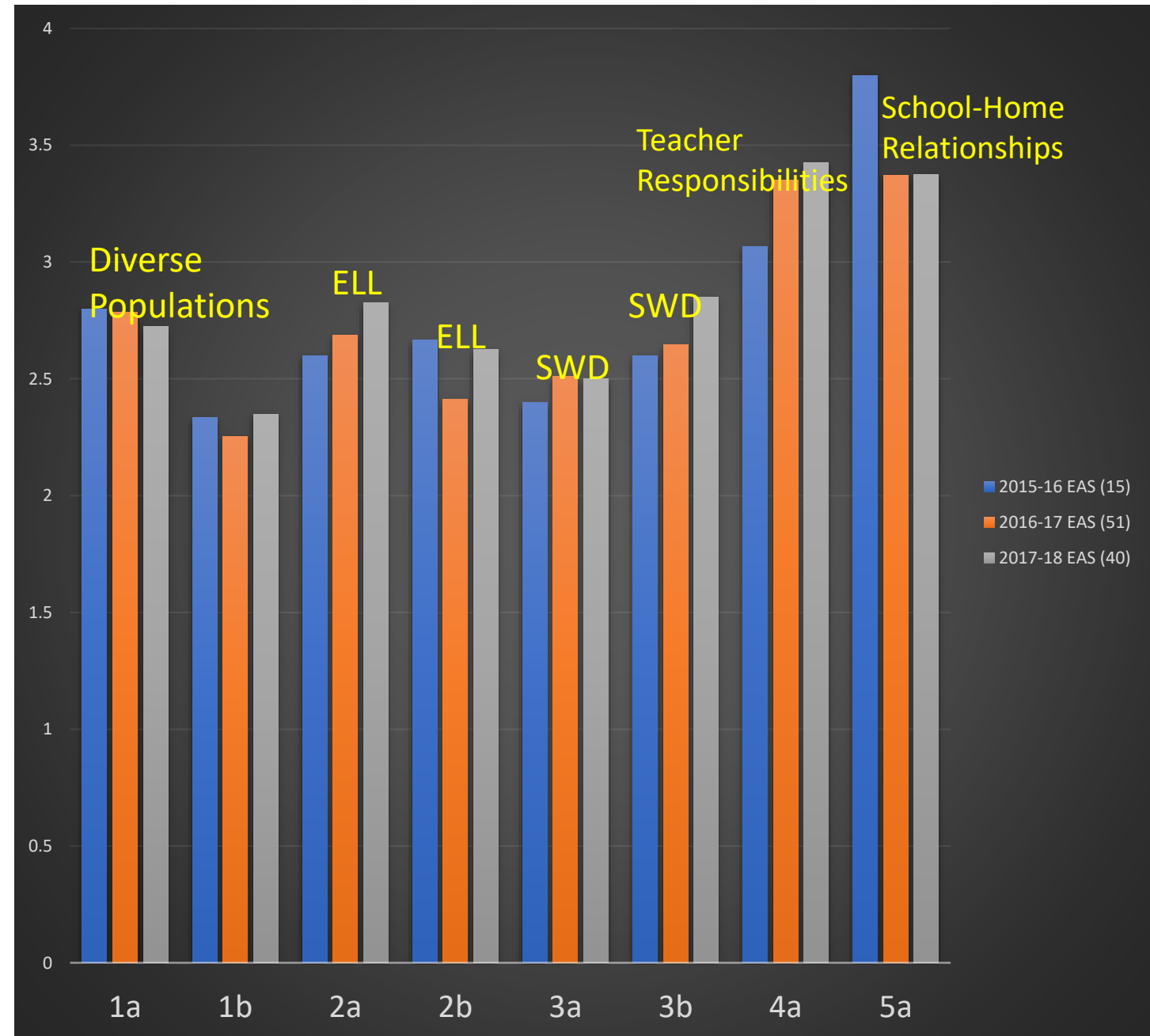

Possible Interpretation:

Candidates performed better on multiple choice compared to constructed response for “Diverse Populations” and “ELL” topics.



Summary & Interpretation:

- ✓ Advanced level candidates tend to perform slightly better on CST than initial candidates.
- ✓ EAS Pass rates at initial level have improved (97 to 100% in past few years; slight).

- ✓ **Strength**- Teacher Responsibilities and Home/School Relationships; Candidates did better writing about SWD compared to multiple choice on same topic.
- ✓ **Relative Weakness**- Writing about & interpreting data/"exhibits" about ELL & Diverse Populations compared to multiple choice.
