# **Persistence and Retention**



**Persistence** is the percentage of first time, full time matriculated students who return for the first spring term after initial fall enrollment.


Retention is the percentage of first-time, full time matriculated students who return for the next fall term.

Graduation Rate is the percentage of first time, full time matriculated students who complete their program within 4 years/5 years. (5-year rate is a cumulative percent of 4 and 5.)

**Transfer-Out Rates** include students who were matriculated at Buff State for at least one year and left (includes transfers, drop-outs, and unknown)








Retention for TEU & BSC: % returning for second fall semester (UG)






## Transfer-Out Rate (1yr)

# **General Summary**

### • PERSISTENCE & RETENTION:

- TEU transfer students tend to persist and retain at higher rates than first time/fulltime TEU candidates (and BSC overall)
- Slight downward trend in persistence for FT/FT TEU candidates since 2016 but upward trend in retention.
- TEU students transfer out at much lower rates than BSC overall.
- TEU is better than the college, overall (for persistence, retention, and transfer out rates after 1 year).

#### GRADUATION RATES:

- TEU 4 & 5 year graduation rates better than the college, overall, but still fairly low for students entering as education majors freshman year.
- At 4 years, non-white students graduate at slightly lower rates than white (but is comparable at 5 and 6 years).

#### TRANSFER OUT RATES:

- Rates between TEU & college follow similar pattern, although TEU rates lower, overall.
- Improved for TEU/BSC since 2010, however appear to be on a very mild uptick since 2014. Could increase in next few years as more students could transfer out.
