- v. IGPE (International Graduate Programs for Educators) Cathy Beecroft presenting notes from Brandon:
  - The IGPE is in the process of submitting a letter of intent to the SUNY system to add Escuela Internacional Sampedrana in Honduras as a new site.
  - Later this spring, the IGPE will be reactivating two dormant sites in Mexico:
    - o San Roberto School in Monterrey, Mexico
    - The American School of Torreon in Torreon, Mexico
  - Along with Dean Paterson and Dr. del Prado Hill, I had the pleasure
    of presenting on our International Professional Development Schools
    (IPDS) programs at the National Association of School University
    Partnerships (NASUP) annual conference. The presentation
    highlighted the collaborative international initiatives and
    professional development opportunities offered through our SOE.

- A lot of little things:
  - o RADAR Reminder: Job offers or Interviewing do not say they certified in a reference letter; yet if teacher candidate has a job offer reach out to Patty for a form
  - TeachNY and Financial Aid --> recruitment; 600,000 subscribers and information about education programs across our state; funding for fees; reminders to people who enroll
    - BSU Admissions will be meeting with them too
  - Cert Office Meeting ---> meeting CST waivers are now available to students; if students fail CST and has a 3.5 GPA them may be eligible for a CST waiver; it is now retroactive for teacher candidates who failed by a certain metric as far back as a "reasonable amont of time" (est. 2014; SBL goes back a little further)
  - The metric is different for each exam metrics are post on the NYSED TEACH
    website; passing score and waiver score; BSU Teacher Cert website is being updated
    to reflect this information asap
- VII. TEUPAC Update (Sherri Weber and Pixita del Prado) see note above about pending name change of PDS to Professional Development Partnership
- VIII. Unit Head Report (Wendy Paterson/Raquel Schmidt)
  - SUNY is stating that NO pre-major will be available/allowed per SUNY policy
  - No longer in catalog for GPA and grade-point average; we can have a pre-req on the course itself; check out SUNY Cortland's admissions website for an example
  - We may need to revisit how we address this change from the past ways of posting it in public manner; review your programs and pre-req for courses, but do not make significant changes at this time. Reach out to Raquel about catalog questions.
  - Undergraduate acceptances of new students will be in a grade range of 75 or a C
  - Preliminary conversations with Deans and Provost; we might need to also discuss with Professional Advisors – what and how they are informing students; look at ROADMAPS and use them with students/advisees
    - o Ex: EDU 211 compared to EDU 202 and EDU 201
    - o EXE 100
  - Admissions Graduate is 3.0 yet cannot be posted on website or catalog in public place contact Scott Goodman
  - Wendy will share TEC questions and re-update; at this time, look at each program should look at catalog and check courses regarding GPA requirements; check mechanisms that may allow you to enforce admissions requirements reasonably; give Wendy your proposals and she will share with Provost.
  - Provide Wendy with Feedback ASAP
  - GOOD NEWS in meetings with President and Deans; Education programs are doing well, keeping enrollments strong and managing faculty and sections well.
  - **Group Discussion:** Denise (Career and Professional Development) shared that education and tech (CTE) is in high-demand; post-bac numbers are great and FACS is up too; BME (business); questions about post-bac to be initial master's or grad student level (there are a lot of clunky issues with it); **Steve M. and Patty R.**
